



The Port of Ayr will play a crucial role in the delivery of turbine components to South Kyle Wind Farm.

Throughout Spring 2022, the Port of Ayr, will be receiving wind turbine towers and blades for South Kyle and will play a crucial role in storing and transporting these important components to site.

Run by the Association of British Ports, Ayr is the primary import port for wind farm machinery in the West Coast of Scotland.

The Port of Ayr's relationship with Vattenfall has spanned a decade and goes back to when the initial application for South Kyle was submitted. Stuart Cresswell Chairman of the British Ports Association Scottish Ports Group and Ayr Port Manager commented:
